Health and Safety Reminders

- Children should stay home when they show any symptoms of deviation from normal health.
- If a child is brought to school with any symptoms of communicable illness, a doctor's note must be provided to return to school.
- Check every Friday if your child has extra clothes available in his/her cubby and replenish them as needed.
- Label your child's belongings, and take home any soiled clothes at the end of the day.
- Beddings and blankets must be taken home for washing every Friday, so that they are ready for use the following week.

APMS Second Annual Science Fair



Admission Procedures

Admission at LAPMS depends on space and availability. Simply follow a few easy steps to get the admission process started!

- Call to schedule a tour. The school director gives tours at 9:00-11:00 A.M. during the Montessori activity period. This is the best time to observe the children at work with different subject areas.
- Fill out an application form and pay \$100 non-refundable registration fee.
- Complete a packet of health clearance and immunization records.
- Read the Parent Handbook.
- Schedule an orientation.
- Complete packet of paperwork and orientation prior to child's start date.
- Set up codes for drop-off and pick-up and take identification pictures for
 ProCare system.

If you are bringing goody bags for the children, please ensure that they contain only educational items, such as small books, crayons, erasers, or pencils.
